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# Three Main EU Institutional Actors

#### Commission

Technocrats fr Member-States, appt'd by Council w EP approval

(Spitzenkandidat?) +Comm President

Represents overall EU interests, acts in Public Interest

#### Council

Member-state leaders indirectly elected by national citizens Represents national governments, acts in National Interest

### European Parliament (EP)

Legislative Representatives directly elected by citizens in MS Represents EU citizens/, organized in political parties Acts in public interest or political interest?

• Influence by citizens: Opportunities in all three venues

# Legislative process begins with Commission

#### Commission initiates legislation

- Altho Council/EP can request legislative proposals
  95% of laws ordinary legislation
  80% legislation decided in Commission!
- **Process of development** (in each Directorate-General)
  Junior civil servant bg process
  - consulting, hearings w experts, lobbies, interest groups
  - Industry predominates

But Comm welcomes public interest groups/civil society

- Access/influence depends on org
  - From int'l, trans-nat'l vs nat'l—eg., environment vs immigration
- Trust/cooperation key to on-going influence
- Once have legislative proposal, goes to College of Commissioners

# Commission then sends proposal to

## Council

- European Council
  - + Councils of Ministers 10 configurations, e.g., Gen affairs, ECOFIN, Agrifish, EMPL, ENV. Justice/Home
- 150 working groups w experts
   Coreper (MS reps/ambassadors)
- When agreed, send to Council
  - Meets in secretIf agreed (vote by QMV), goes to
- TRILOGUES

  1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> (conciliation), 3<sup>rd</sup> reading

### Parliament

Divided by Parties

- Many diff groupings, e.g., EPP, Soc/Dem, ECR, Greens, Left,
- Legislation sent to committee
   Rapporteur fr pol group to
   which file attributed
   Chair elected by committee
- When agreed, goes to EP vote, then TRILOGUES

Chair + rapporteur lead negoti's Other parties not rep'd

# IF no influence from Inside, exert pressure from **OUTSIDE**

#### Protest in the streets

by economic interests (e.g., farmers) by civil society / social movements (e.g., vs. Bolkestein workers' directive 2005/6)

#### European Citizens' Initiative

1 million signatures collected (by trans-national networks)

#### Citizens Assemblies

e.g., Conference on the Future of Europe to discuss how to improve EU (with expert testimony, citizen involvement, etc.)

#### EU public consultations
